Angus Carrick Update: November 13, 2023

Searching for dinosaur tracks on the Playa de Vega, walking on Roman roads and drinking rough cider poured in the traditional way.

We were woken up at 06.00 by a group of loud spanish men, so we had an early breakfast. The hostel had left out a roll, tiny cake and lollipop for each for us, which wasn't all that much, but we all enjoyed breakfast together anyway. We set off cross country down to Vega beach, where we spent some time looking for dinosaur footprints and trying to smash rocks together for crystals or fossils. From there, there was a river blocking the way along the beach, so we followed the camino up a medieval road to the clifftops. The path wound around the cliffs an then down to La Espasa,

where we had a snack at some windswept picnic tables, and then walked along the esplanade looking at the tourists having drinks behind glass screens. We continued along a Roman road, with an interesting set of narrow, parallel walkways over a stream. Arriving in Colunga, we found the hotel we had planned to stay in, which was not ideal, not having breakfast or clotheswashing facilities, but we decided to stop anyway, and Sue managed to wash some clothes in the hand basin. We then had a delicious and filling meal in the hotel bar, a local delicacy consisting of broad bean stew with sausage meat and bacon, accompanied by a tuna, olive and tomato salad and a bottle of the local cider. (Our host demonstrated the traditional way of pouring cider in order to aerate it. Quite a lot ended up on the floor!)
