


S30 Way of St. James (Camino) Doriga to Bodenaya

The monastery of San Salvador de Cornellana was all shut up, so we headed uphill out of the town , pausing at a rest stop for biscuits and to refill our water. From there it was wooded trails and some motorway building sites, past a rest area with drinks machines to a church that was collecting money for a new roof by letting pilgrims

donate and sign roof tiles. From there a long straight road under construction with a closed church of Santiago and a picnic spot and watering hole at the end. Then a stop for sandwiches at a wonderful Albergue - the La Figal De Xugabolos. Unfortunately it was too early to stop, but we rested and enjoyed the rest under the old granary. And on we went through Salas, where they were preparing for a festival, and up a long wooded river valley to country roads when it started to pour with rain. It was extremely wet and windy, and it seemed we would never get to our destination. We finally arrived cold, wet and exhausted to be greeted warmly by David and Celia at the Bodenaya pilgrims hostel, where after getting warm and dry, we had a relaxed evening over a communal dinner with a fun group.
